2023 Global Leadership Award Recipient: Maxwell Funo

Maxwell Funo is the principal at Mkhanyiseli primary school in KTC township situated in Nyanga Cape Town, South Africa. Maxwell has been teaching at the school for 25 years and was promoted to be the principal in July 2021. He received his degree at the University of Cape Town in Education Management and Leadership Development.

Mkhanyiseli primary school dates back to 1950, and its community has been facing the harsh realities of unemployment for years. Maxwell stated that he "strongly believes that the poor background of these learners should not be a determining factor of their destiny." Maxell has a strong vision for the future of the school and its students. He is a tireless advocate to provide them with the resources needed to make their education meaningful and possible.

Mr. Funo is very passionate about e-Learning and recently won a competition sponsored by Microsoft Partners in Learning (MSPiL) in the categories of 'Collaboration' and 'Innovation in a challenging context,' representing South Africa in the Middle East in Morocco.



In 2023, Acacia Global continued working with dedicated partners in the townships outside of Cape Town, South Africa. Here are a few of the projects that you supported:

Leadership:

MCSJ: Community Capacity Building

- Street Transformation Program, made up of 35 chapters which help their communities with work on crime prevention and education about social grants, funeral programs, and how to obtain an ID.
- The Men's Forum teaches skills such as mowing lawns and painting. They hold meetings to discuss gender violence issues and how to be a good partner and father.
- MCSJ has been working with the government to improve the healthcare system in the township.
- The Bike Program protects the community, patrolling their neighborhoods to increase safety, delivering much needed medications and food items.

AEDC: Economic Development

- Their focus has been teaching income generation for women and their families with their sewing, crocheting and knitting programs. They're also teaching how to grow and maintaining home gardens.
- AEDC's Girls Initiative is working to educate youth and teens about healthy eating habits, well-being and personal safety.

Garden Program:

 The garden at Mkhanyiseli Primary School has yielded enough food to sustain their kitchen and generate income for the garden volunteers. They educate the children about good nutrition, growing plants, and how to create their own gardens.

Education:

 Acacia Global continues to support education by working with Principal Maxwell Funo of the Mkhanyiseli Primary School. We donated 16 computers, upgraded the computer infrastructure and rehabbed 35 computers.
